COMMUNION TODAY

The Lord's Supper is described in 1 Corinthians 11:23-32 as a most precious medicine for the soul. Like all medicines, of course, it must be used at the right time, for the right purpose, by HOLY COMMUNION the right person, lest it do more harm than good. For this reason we ask all communicants to properly prepare themselves through

self-examination. (You may use the Personal Preparation For Holy Communion found on page 156 of your hymnal.) Based on the Word of God in 1 Corinthian 10:17 we also practice Close Communion, that is, Holy Communion is for those who share a common confession and fellowship. Members of the WELS and ELS are welcome to join us in the Lord's Supper. We ask that all visitors wishing to commune speak with the pastor before approaching the Lord's Table.

Isaiah 25:6-9

The Lord Almighty promises his saints, all those who trust in him, that he will destroy the shroud of death.

⁶On this mountain the LORD Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine — the best of meats and the finest of wines. ⁷On this mountain he will destroy the shroud that enfolds all peoples, the sheet that covers all nations; ⁸he will swallow up death forever. The Sovereign LORD will wipe away the tears from all faces; he will remove the disgrace of his people from all the earth. The LORD has spoken.

⁹In that day they will say, "Surely this is our God; we trusted in him, and he saved us. This is the LORD, we trusted in him; let us rejoice and be glad in his salvation."

Second Scripture Lesson

Revelation 20:4-6

St. John sees those who had been killed because of their faith in Christ now living and reigning with him in glory.

⁴I saw thrones on which were seated those who had been given authority to judge. And I saw the souls of those who had been beheaded because of their testimony for Jesus and because of the word of God. They had not worshiped the beast or his image and had not received his mark on their

foreheads or their hands. They came to life and reigned with Christ a thousand years. ⁵(The rest of the dead did not come to life until the thousand years were ended.) This is the first resurrection. ⁶Blessed and holy are those who have part in the first resurrection. The second death has no power over them, but they will be priests of God and of Christ and will reign with him for a thousand years.

Verse of the Day

Revelation 7:15

Alleluia. They are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple. Alleluia.

Gospel Lesson

John 11:32-44

Jesus demonstrates his power over death.

- ³² When Mary reached the place where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."
- ³³ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. ³⁴ "Where have you laid him?" he asked.
 - "Come and see, Lord," they replied.
 - ³⁵ Jesus wept.
 - ³⁶ Then the Jews said, "See how he loved him!"
- ³⁷ But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?"
- ³⁸ Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. ³⁹ "Take away the stone," he said.
- "But, Lord," said Martha, the sister of the dead man, "by this time there is a bad odor, for he has been there four days."
- ⁴⁰ Then Jesus said, "Did I not tell you that if you believed, you would see the glory of God?"
- ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me."
 - ⁴³ When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come

out!" ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go."
